We are delighted to invite all para alpine ski racers to New Zealand for the Winter Games NZ 2019, which marks ten years since the inaugural Games were held in 2009. From August 23rd to September 7th over 800 of the world's best winter sports athletes will descend on New Zealand to compete in 26 events across 9 different sports.

We are excited that Para Alpine Ski Racing returns to the Winter Games NZ sports programme with the inclusion of WPAS Southern Hemisphere Cup Super G, Slalom and Giant Slalom races. The speed events will take place at Coronet Peak and will see both para and able-bodied athletes competing on the same day and on the same piste. The racing will then move to Cardrona Alpine Resort, the home of Para Alpine Skiing in New Zealand, for the technical events.

Entries for the WPAS Southern Hemisphere Cup races open on July 1st and can be made via the WPAS [online entry system](#).

The Winter Games NZ is based across the 3 towns of Queenstown, Wanaka and Naseby in the South Island of New Zealand. The Curling Tournament will take place in the Maniototo Curling Rink in Naseby and the Trans-Tasman Challenge Ice Hockey matches will be played at the Queenstown Ice Arena. The mountain events are held at Cardrona Alpine Resort (Freeski, Snowboarding & Para Alpine Skiing), Coronet Peak (Alpine & Para Alpine Skiing), The Remarkables (Freeride) and Snow Farm NZ (Cross Country Skiing).

Venue

[Coronet Peak](#) will host the WPAS Southern Hemisphere Cup Speed Races and is one of two ski fields based in Queenstown, New Zealand. Coronet Peak possesses some of the most diverse terrain of any mountain in the Southern Lakes. Entry Fees

\$50 NZD per race for the SHC Super G, Giant Slalom and Slalom to be paid at the first Team Captain’s Meeting for each race.

Lift Tickets - Coronet Peak

Lift tickets for the speed events at Coronet Peak can be purchased before the first TCM on Sunday 25 August from the Swiss-Belresort (161Arthurs Point Road, Queenstown) between 4.30pm - 6pm. Athlete Adult passes are \$59.50 and Youth passes (U18) are \$28.50 (50% discount) and coaches will be given 1 free lift pass per 6 athletes. Extra coaches passes will be at athlete prices.

Lift Tickets - Cardrona Alpine Resort

Lift tickets for the technical events at Cardrona Alpine Resort can be purchased before the first TCM on Tuesday 3 September from the Lake Wanaka Centre between 5pm - 6pm. Athlete Adult passes are \$60 and Youth passes (U18) are \$31 (50% discount) and coaches will be given 1 free lift pass per 8 athletes. For extra coaches outside the 1:8 ratio, lift passes are \$75.



Cancellation Policy

There will be a 100% refund of entry fees and unused lift tickets if we do not get a race away. Refunds will only be given for payments made on credit card.

Rescue & Medical Service

Coronet Peak/Cardrona Ski Patrol and a doctor will be on site for the duration of the event. A medical plan will be available at the Team Captain's Meeting.

Awards

Medal ceremonies will take place on mountain at the end of each competition final. Podium placing athletes are obligated to attend these ceremonies and should be available for media interviews and athlete signings immediately after the awards.

TRAVEL, LOGISTICS & ACCOMMODATION

Visas

New Zealand has a special policy for athletes, coaches, administrators, officials and support staff visiting the country to participate in sporting events. Please check with NZ Immigration to find out if visitors from your country require a visitor visa to enter New Zealand. Information and application forms for visitor visas are available on www.immigration.govt.nz or from New Zealand and Australian Consulates, Embassies or High commissions.

Liability & Insurance

All athletes, officials and members of the National Associations who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Winter Games NZ, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by the athletes, official or other person in conjunction with the organising or staging of the event. Public Liability Insurance (CHF) 3 million, for the period of the event, is in place.

If you are injured in New Zealand (including whilst competing in a competition), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your care – and that means paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand. You will accordingly still need to arrange your own travel and medical insurance. New Zealand's medical facilities are not free to visitors except as a result of an accident but even in the case of an accident, surcharges in private facilities will apply.

Air travel

We recommend that you book your flights as early as possible and fly into Queenstown or Christchurch depending on your travel plans. Air New Zealand, Jetstar, Qantas and Virgin Australia are the only airlines flying directly into Queenstown. However many others come into Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch.



Car/Van Transport

We highly recommend that teams organise their own transport to ensure full control over movement to and from the resort. There are a number of rental companies close to the Queenstown International Airport that have a range of car and van options to suit everyone's budget.
